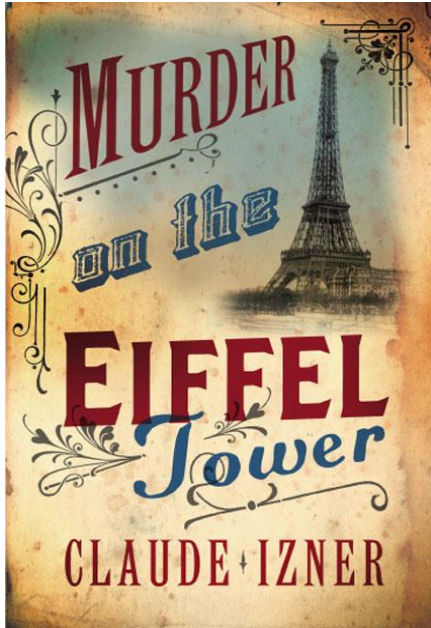


GALLIC**MURDER ON THE EIFFEL TOWER**
